Standing on the Shoulders
of Our Ancestors



Parashat Kedoshim

Leviticus 19:1-20:27

Aaron collects the crimson liquid, dashing the warm red blood upon the fiery altar. A few verses later, the Torah warns our ancestors, and the non-Jews who lived among them, that whenever they kill an animal for food or sacrifice, they shouldn't ingest its blood: "*Ki nefesh kol bassar da-mo*"—the life of all flesh is blood. Blood, God warns a final time, is life.

Our ancestors understood blood's power. They respected it and feared it. But to many of us, this seems like religious hocus-pocus. We're sophisticated and modern; we don't need to spatter blood on stones to feel God's power. Who needs this part of the Torah anyway? That's what I used to think—until I became a blood donor.

Walk into any blood donor site and you'll see amazing people. Some of them donate for no reason other than anonymous good. Most are there because it's one of the few tangible things they can do to help a loved one facing the scalpel or the oncologist. These people next to me, their arms sprouting tubes of red, filling bags as they pump and squeeze a ball of foam—whose life are they here to save? Marvel at the miracle of people giving a little of themselves to someone they love.

In five places, the Torah reminds us to treat blood with reverence. So rather than dismiss all that draining and dashing of blood in this week's *parashah* as outdated nonsense, we can recognize the power of blood. And now, we can do more than sanctify that power—we can actually transfuse it.

So many of us live in the fast lane on the 405, balancing life between work and family, routine and full activity, cell phone and eternal electronic connection. We yearn for quiet, for re-creation, for release. And in our tradition, we are blessed with Shabbat. When we take a full Shabbat, it's a time away from the ties that bind us to the work world, and we can be renewed. How? Joining together in prayer; blessing the challah, the wine and our children at Shabbat dinner; hiking along the trails between the city and the valley; strolling along the incredible California seashore—all of these can enhance Shabbat at home. Based in study and tradition, our programs always link our past to our present. Our participants, with the guidance of their educators, explore the ideas of our ancestors as they develop into the next generation of Jews.

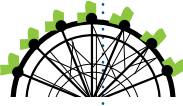
