Who Is Like YOU?

B'shallach: Exodus 13:17-17:16

This week, we read one of the great narratives in Torah: The Israelites make their exodus, come to the edge of the Red Sea, the sea parts, the Israelites walk through and are saved from the pursuing Egyptians. Reaching the other side unharmed, they sing a poetic song of gratitude and praise, one whose opening words we know well from our prayers: *Mi cha'mocha ba'elim Adonai, mi ka'mocha neb'edar ba'kodesh*—Who is like You among the gods, Adonai; who is like you, magnificent in holiness?

This beautiful, timeless piece of text teaches that God is always with us, ready to “jump into battle” to save us. But is that really how life works? So many of us have experienced “bad things happening to good people,” and all of us are witnesses to this in one way or another—the Holocaust, Darfur and September 11, to name a few. Instead of imagining God is “up there” waiting to

swoop down or ride in, like the white knight on the stallion, I believe we must—for our emotional and rational well-being—find another way of imagining God's actions in the world.

We can read and sing *Mi cha'mocha* with great reverence for its ancient metaphoric meaning. But in today's complicated world, I choose to imagine God in a different way. I believe that God, rather than a Divine Being wholly separate from us “somewhere” in the heavens, is within each of us—that spark of holiness that, while perhaps not able to move mountains or part seas, can nonetheless perform the “everyday miracles” necessary to heal our broken world...the outstretched hand, the “I love you” at night, the *tzedakah* and so much more. I believe we are created in the Divine image, so let us imagine: “Who is like YOU?”—able to help bring peace and healing to the world?

From Tevye to Puck, We Have It All!

Walking through the halls of Brawerman Elementary School, you will always hear sounds of learning: the clicking of computer keyboards, math computations, discussions from Hebrew, science and American history classes. But lately, you may be surprised to also hear profound questions such as “What say you, Hermia?” or “Golde, do you love me?”

Students in the after-school enrichment drama program, in conjunction with the Youth Academy of Dramatic Arts (YADA), are preparing for a musical production of *Fiddler on the Roof*, to be presented on March 24, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. The sixth grade is currently rehearsing *A Midsummer Night’s Dream*, scheduled for February 12, 2009, at 7:00 p.m.



PACE Program Explores Pre-Independence Israel

Our third and fourth graders and their parents recently journeyed to an older Israel during their PACE (Parent and Child Education) program, held on the Temple Campus. The groups “traveled” across the world and back in time to before the founding of the State of Israel in 1948 to see how the pioneers of Zionism sacrificed, labored, cooperated and rejoiced in rebuilding our homeland.

Educators worked hard to put on a unique program. They came in costume, bringing their pioneer characters to life. Parents were especially excited to hear information geared toward them

and their children.

The Ozrim were excellent tour guides as they led groups from place to place on the campus. They visited the first kibbutz, Degania, where European *olim* (Jewish immigrants to Israel) learned how to tend the land. It was a great place to learn about communal Jewish living. Everyone hotly debated critical issues in a kibbutz meeting that ended with Israeli folk dancing.

Results of the sacrifice and cooperation of the Zionists were on display in the period of very rapid settlement development, where settlers established 52 different towns across Israel overnight. The first underground efforts to defend

Israel, the Haganah and Palmach, also demonstrated what risks people took to make Israel safe.

On Sunday in Stalford Hall, there was a small *ma’abara*, or transit camp, for new immigrants from Middle Eastern countries like Egypt, Lebanon, Syria and Iraq. Members of our Israeli staff shared real-life stories about their family histories. It was quite a lesson for our families to consider together what families in Israel had to endure in the early days of the state.

All three days of the program were well attended, with close to 90 percent of families participating. It was a truly enriching experience for all.

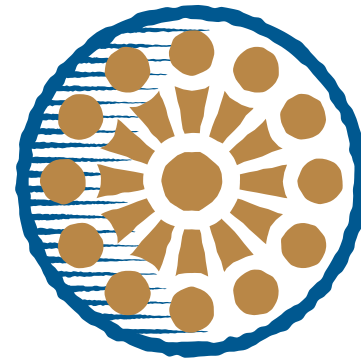
