Even with two wars in less than three years, even as it faces societal and financial struggles, Israel found a place in its heart—and in its home—for a few thousand Darfuri who were brave and lucky enough to escape Sudan. After walking across Egypt, these refugees found safe haven in Israel.

B'nai Darfur (Children of Darfur) is an Israeli-based organization founded to help those men, women and children who have reached our Promised Land, assisting them with housing, clothing, food, Hebrew lessons and job acquisition. Some are already serving in the Israeli military; some will begin this summer. Others are already contributing to Israeli society by working and paying taxes. And yes—among the Darfuri, there are those who have not only decided to live in Israel, but have also become Jewish, linking them to us as members of our sacred covenant.

Now more than ever, it's time to dig deeply into our hearts and model our compassion to our children, both for Israel and for these victims of genocide. This Passover, do the ultimate mitzvah: Help Israel help Darfur.

EXODUS 27:20 - 30:10

“...find an eternal light,
an eternal truth,
and go for it”

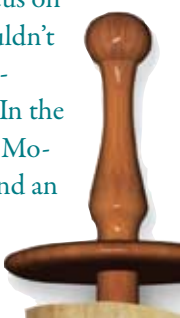
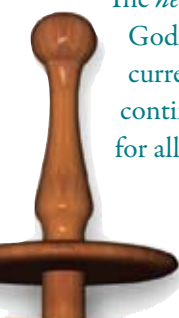
The portion we read this week, Tetzaveh (Exodus 27:20-30:10), reminds us to find our inner passions and talents. It suggests we transform our lives with a good measure of realism and clarity and, above all, stay focused on light.

We learn in this portion that the Jewish people are to establish an eternal burning flame in our holy places of worship. The *ner tamid* is intended to serve as a constant reminder of God’s presence. It is a light that will illumine all generations, current and future. “Aaron will set up this light to burn continuously in the sanctuary. It will serve as a light for God for all generations.”

The portion then outlines detailed job descriptions of each faction of the Jewish people. The High Priests connected us to God, the lower-level Priests served

in the sanctuary, the Levites connected with the Jewish people at a “lower level” than the Priests, and common Israelites were involved in daily tasks and rituals. While today we may reject or question the hierarchy, this was the way to maintain order. Each person had his or her place, obligations and an important role to play. When juxtaposed with the commandment of the *ner tamid*, we learn from this portion that we should focus on being our best at whatever singular thing we do. We shouldn’t try to be something we’re not intended to be. In an often-quoted Hasidic tale, Rabbi Zusya says on his deathbed, “In the world to come, they will not ask me, ‘Why were you not Moses?’ They will ask me, ‘Why were you not Zusya?’” So find an eternal light, an eternal truth and go for it.

Emphasis on Solidarity As CCAR Meets in Israel

When you read this article, I will be at the 120th annual convention of the Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR), the professional organization that provides continuing education and professional development for rabbis throughout North America and Israel. This year, as it does every seven years, the CCAR holds its convention in Israel—emphasizing the centrality of Israel to Reform Jewry.

Amid the tension of the war in Gaza, we assert solidarity with Israel. As in previous years, Reform Jews will not hesitate to be present during conflict. Each American rabbinic class for the last 35 years has studied in Jerusalem and faced the stress alongside Israeli citizens. Rabbis will be engaged in hands-on *tikkun olam* throughout Tel Aviv—in projects that benefit Israeli poor, Jews and Arabs alike. We will even focus on

war and terrorism as part of the Freehof Symposium. We will celebrate the unprecedented flowering of progressive Jewish life in Israel. On Friday, before Shabbat, we will study in the world’s largest gathering of a pluralistic *beit midrash*, bringing together hundreds of Israeli Jews studying with Reform rabbis. We will honor the appointment of Rabbi Ellen Weinberg Dreyfus as the CCAR president, the first woman rabbi to be named president of the Reform rabbis while in Israel. We will celebrate cultural Tel Aviv and the artists involved in the Tel Aviv-Los Angeles Jewish Federation Partnership.

All in all, I hope to enjoy the richness of our cultural and spiritual heritage and return ready to share some of that depth with you.

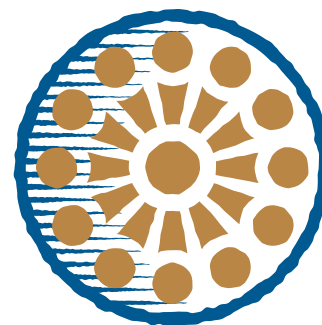
